# Inspiration and ASPIRE-ation



Reflection on our three and a half year collaboration and plans going forward















After three and a half years, the ACoRD project comes to the end of its Erasmus plus funded period and sustainability becomes our focus. Before talking about the future, however, we should reflect on and celebrate what we have achieved.

Our project started in 2019 with training events at University of Nottingham, University of Malaya and University Putra Malaysia in the first year of the project. These highly successful events cemented our collaboration allowing the six partner institutions to get to know each other and share expertise and aspirations.

Around 300 undergraduate students, 180 academicians, 59 administrators and technologists in Higher Education Institutions in Malaysia have been trained in the ASPIRE methodology for creating high quality reusable learning objects (RLOs). The ACoRD repository contains 23 RLOs cocreated by lecturers, students and learning technologists with more RLOs under production (https://acord.my).

# Inspiration and ASPIRE-ation



Reflection on our three and a half year collaboration and plans going forward















The Covid-19 pandemic undoubtedly impacted on our plans for the project. We were not able to travel to our EU partners at the University of Stavanger and Karolinska Institute nor were EU partners able to attend in person the final multistakeholder mini-symposium 'ASPIRE4ALL' hybrid event at Taylor's University in Malaysia.

However, the strength of the collaboration meant that we were able to continue successfully to work during 2020 and 2021 remotely, learning new skills and trying out new online platforms to continue our co-creation workshops, conferences and meetings.



The ASPIRE4ALL event held in April 2022 was a particular success.

The event was the first to be held in Taylor's University VX Learning theatre, a state-of-the-art technology venue for teaching and international hybrid conferences.

This hybrid mini-symposium was attended by over 100 delegates, both onsite and online ine representing 12 universities in Malaysia and 10 universities.

This leads us back to the question of sustainability. It is true that many projects like this one struggle to maintain a level of commitment once funding has ended and the outputs of the project are reported.



There is a real desire between the ACoRD partners to continue to work together and seek additional funding to allow this to happen.

In the meantime, there is already a level of momentum built into sustainability plans via the co-creation, community-based approach offered by the ASPIRE methodology. A bit like ripples in a pond the co-creation workshops act as a droplet entering the water from which impact spreads as participants become interested in how they can create RLOs with their own communities. We can already see this impact from the engagement of groups outside of the ACoRD collaboration using our methodologies in spin off projects.

Sustainability can only be achieved if there is evidence that a product is effective. Implementation and evaluation have been important strands of the ACoRD project. Use of both quantitative and qualitative approaches have been applied to gain a better understanding of how to incorporate digital resources like RLOs into traditional curricula, and importantly what benefits to learning are achieved. We have shown that the students' knowledge increased after using the RLOs and for nearly all the RLOs knowledge remained higher than pre-RLO levels 6 weeks later.



#### KAROLINSKA INSTITUET

Karolinska Institutet (KI), located in Stockholm Sweden, is one of the world's leading medical universities.
